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

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



Howard also recommends laddering your CD investments (one year, three years, five years) so you always have money maturing. That way you have some money available should a more attractive interest rate present itself down the road.



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Porsche Racing, DE and Autocross

ALMS - American LeMans Series - article excerpted and edited from Jill Beck release

FLYING LIZARD MOTORSPORTS PORSCHE 911 GT3 RSR OF BERGMEISTER/LONG SCORE FLAG-TO-FLAG WIN TO SOLIDY ALMS GT2 POINTS LEAD

TOOELE, UT. – May 17 – The #45 Flying Lizard Porsche 911 GT3 RSR of Patrick Long (USA) and Joerg Bergmeister (Germany) and the #87 Farnbacher Loles Racing Porsche 911 GT3 RSR of Wolf Henzler/Marc Lieb (both Germany), ran like a freight train as they lead every lap, going flag-to-flag to claim an impressive GT2 one-two class victory. Porsche's two top GT2 class challengers – the second place qualifying Ferrari of Melo/Kaffer and the fourth place qualifying BMW of Milner/Mueller – tangled on the front straight just yards past the green flag on the very first lap. They placed themselves at a tremendous disadvantage for class honors when they came together, sending the damaged BMW to the pits for several laps for repairs and sending the Ferrari off in to the infield.

GRAND-AM Rolex Series – articles excerpted and edited from Jill Beck releases

PORSCHE TEAMS IN DP AND GT SHUT OUT OF TOP SPOTS, BUT IN THE THICK OF CLASS CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS AS ROLEX GRAND-AM SERIES COMPLETES ROUND FOUR AT LAGUNA SECA

MONTEREY, CA (May 17) – A stop-and-go penalty for jumping a restart was very costly to the Penske Porsche Riley during the Verizon Wireless Festival of Speed, the fourth race of the 2009 Rolex Grand-Am Sports Car Series. The Penske team wound up finishing sixth at Laguna Seca, 13.3 seconds behind the winning Pontiac Riley. The #58 Brumos Porsche Riley entry of Darren Law (Phoenix, AZ) and David Donohue (Malvern, PA) finished eighth and lost their Daytona Prototype driver's championship points lead. The Rolex GT entry of Leh Keen (Charleston, SC) and Dirk Werner (Germany) recorded the 245th podium finish for Porsche in Rolex Grand-Am GT competition. They drove their #87 Farnbacher Loles Racing Porsche 911 GT3 Cup entry to a third-place GT finish.

Werner, Keen Win GT Class and Take Points Lead; Bernhard, Dumas Enjoy Podium Finish at Watkins Glen

WATKINS GLEN, NY – June 6 -- Dirk Werner (Germany) and Leh Keen (Charleston, SC) captured their second GT class victory of the season and took over the points lead while Porsche works drivers Timo Bernhard (Germany) and RomainDumas (France) grabbed a podium finish in Daytona Prototype competition. Werner drove the final segment in the #87 Farnbacher Loles Racing Porsche 911 GT3 Cup entry and took the checkered flag in the fifth Grand-Am Rolex Sports Car Series event of the season. It was Porsche's 59th GT victory and 247th podium finish in Grand-Am history. Meanwhile, Bernhard and Dumas put the #12 Verizon Wireless Penske Porsche Riley on the podium for second time this year, finishing just 1.59 seconds behind the dominate Lexus Riley of Scott Pruett (Auburn, CA) and Memo Rojas (Mexico) as the race ended under caution.

Emmanuel Collard. The Team Essex, which came in second in LMP2 a year ago, beat its Lola Judd rival by more than 14 laps. Porsche lost its chance for a one-two LMP2 RS Spyder finish only an hour before the end of the race, as the RS Spyder entry of NAVI Team GOH spun off the track while running comfortably in second place. Under braking for the first chicane on the Hunaudières straight on an oil spill of a competitor, Japanese driver Seiji Ara hit the barriers and the car was forced to retire.

While the Porsche RS Spyder is just a memory in North America, it was certainly alive at the checkered flag for the 24 Hours of Le Mans as the iconic LMP2 sports prototype captured its second Le Mans class win in two tries thanks to the Danish customer team of Casper Elgaard, Kristian Poulsen, and Porsche factory driver

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LeMans 24 (cont'd)

In the production-based GT2 class, a one-two qualifying effort for the Porsche 911 GT3 RSR from qualifying could not be turned into a race success. After just two hours, the race came to an end for the three Porsche works drivers Marc Lieb (Germany), Richard Lietz (Austria) and Wolf Henzler (Germany). A problem with the fuel system caused the engine of the 911 to die and not start again – 100 meters from the entrance to the pit lane. As the regulations do not allow a car to be towed in such a case, the leading trio of the German Felbermayr-Protonteam had no chance to repair the otherwise technically perfect 911 and retired.

For the American Flying Lizard team, the 2009 Le Mans race ended in the early morning hours when Darren Law (USA) collided heavily with the barriers. Prior to this, pole-setter Jörg Bergmeister (Germany) and team owner Seth Neiman (USA) were steadily moving in the direction of a podium result with their GT3 RSR. The French IMSA Performance Matmut team with Porsche works drivers Patrick Pilet (France) and Patrick Long (USA) as well as Raymond Narac (France) maintained third place for more than two-thirds of the race distance. OnSunday morning a problem with the power transmission put an end to their promising charge.

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LeMans 24 Hour Event at SE Perfomance



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This seemed like a very good article on suspension alignments written up in the Space Coast news magazine" Escape *Velocity*". so with their permission, here's a reprint.

FYI – **Porsche of Orlando** performs the alignment service exactly the same as described below but uses a John Bean Visualiner 3D machine (see Jim for your alignment).

Tech Corner

This month I would like to talk about suspension alignments. Let's start with a discussion of the basic geometry involved in an alignment followed by how this affects ride quality.

The positions of the individual wheels in relation to the body and the road surface are instrumental in defining the characteristics of a chassis. The wheel position directly influences a vehicle's straight-ahead tracking, cornering performance, and tire wear. A number of these values are determined in the course of wheel alignment. The others are derived from physical laws based on certain motion sequences - such as steering movements or dynamic loads during driving (so-called kinematics).



Toe is the angle of each tire in relation to the center-line of the vehicle. Tires with "toe-in" are


angled inward; those with "toe-out" are angled outward.



Camber is the angle between the wheel's center plane and a vertical passing line through the wheel contact point. It is positive when the upper part of the wheel is

inclined outward from the wheel's

center plane and negative when the upper part of the wheel is inclined inward.



Castor is the inclination of the steering axis in the direction of the vehicle center line. Posi-

tive castor applies when the wheel contact point is located behind the point at which the extended steering angle pierces the road surface. When the wheel contact point is located in front of the piercing point, this represents negative castor.


Toe: To ensure precise steering behavior, it is important to have a degree of lateral traction on the front wheels by means of toe-in. A little toe-in on the rear axle results in axle stability. The amount of toe-in is limited by the growing level of tire wear.

Camber: A tire provides the greatest lateral traction during cornering when it is perpendicular to the road. In the case of independent wheel suspension, the wheels experience the body roll when cornering as a change in camber, i.e. the wheel on the outside of the bend experiences considerable positive camber. As this cannot be fully compensated for by the change in camber during deflection, a negative basic camber is set as a reserve. A wheel running with camber behaves like a cone rolling on its lateral surface in a circular path. It thus generates a degree of

lateral force in the direction of the vehicle centre line even during straight-ahead driving (so-called cone rolling effect) thus causing the sensation of 'pulling'. Excessive Camber will cause tire wear and possible overheating of the tires.

Castor: The distance between the wheel contact point and the piercing point is known as the castor trail. During steering movements, the castor trail causes the lateral force to generate a moment about the steering axis that pushes the front wheels back into the straight-ahead position. This stabilizes straightahead running. Castor does not have any negative effects on tire wear. Too great a difference between the left and right wheel will result in poor straight-ahead tracking, also resulting in a 'pulling' sensation.

As you have seen, setting up a chassis correctly is a highly complex matter. All the components have to be tuned and coordinated so as to enable optimum and safe transmission of power to the road at all times. All settings relating to the axle geometry are checked by the means of a wheel alignment process. The Hunter machine at Porsche of Melbourne uses high definition digital cameras measuring targets mounted to each wheel.
