

I hadn't been to the Amelia Island Concours in a number of years but knew its reputation put it not far behind the Pebble Beach Concours, mother of all car shows. When my nephew announced he was visiting me from New York the weekend of the Amelia event, I decided to take him for the Sunday Concours held March 9th on the fairways of The Golf Club of Amelia Island next to the Ritz-Carlton. The weather was picture perfect and the event lived up to its reputation with more than 325 cars and motorcycles in attendance for sun-drenched attendees to appreciate. Racing great Jochen Mass was the featured honoree and judges included a long list of Who's Who in motorcycles in cluding Hardey Hardey and David

torsports including Hurley Haywood and David Hobbs, familiar faces to many Citrus members. Wayne Carini, of 'Chasing Classic Cars' TV fame, as well as 'Car Crazy' Barry Meguiar were honorary judges.

Mass, a Formula 1 racer from 1973-82 won only one race and retired after the tragic death of Giles Villeneuve. But he found great success in endurance racing after that, winning the Sebring 12 Hour in 1987 in a Porsche 962 and the 24 Hours of Le Mans in 1989 in a Mercedes. He has been quoted as saying his favorite racing car of all time is the Porsche 962.

The Concours awards Best of Show for two designations — Concours d'Elegance and Concours de Sport. Best of Show Concours d'Elegance went to the 1937 Horch 853 Voll and Ruhrbeck Sport Cabriolet, owned by Robert M. Lee of

Sparks, Nevada. In 1935, the Horch Company, founded by August Horch in 1899, introduced a new model with a 5-liter, straight-eight engine called the Horch 850. The shorter wheelbase 853 model, which won Best of Show, was popular among Germany's rich and famous, offering luxury at a competitive price. The last Horch was built in 1958. The winning automobile is one of only two Horchs ever to have been bodied by coachbuilder Voll and Ruhrbeck, which created custom coachwork for Bugatti, Maybach, Mercedes-Benz and Cord among others. Exhaustive efforts were made to restore this silver 853 to original standards, with no part going untouched as to authenticity or originality by the restoration.



Best of Show Concours de Sport was awarded to the 1958 Scarab Mark II Sports Racer owned by Miles C. Collier and presented by the Revs Institute for Automotive Research of Naples, Florida. The three frontengined Scarab sports racers built by Troutman and Barnes for Lance Reventlow were created to contest the road courses of America against the European marques. Reventlow originally tried an Offenhauser engine in this car but the engine, designed to run on alcohol, was not successful running the gasoline required by the sports car ruling body. The sports racer known as Meister Brauser I was then fitted with a small block Chevrolet V-8, which was tailor-made for the American road and airport circuits of the late 1950s and early 1960s.

It's about an hour and a half to the Sebring International Raceway from Orlando at 6am but add another half hour during the day due to many new traffic lights [and traffic] along Route 27. With the 12 Hour race starting at 10:15am, half the enjoyment is visiting the garages and pits before the start, so getting there early is a must. PCA had its tent and corral just inside the facility entrance and the gate workers affixed [glued] my Porsche Corral sticker to my windshield for access. PCA volunteers, led by Zone 12 Representative David O'Neill, directed parking and staffed the tent activities. By 10am, with anticipation mounting, final pre-race ceremonies, including skydivers, pipers, and national anthem were seen and heard. The weather was perfect and IMSA was hoping for close contests in the 4 race categories, Prototype [P], Prototype Challenge [PC], GT LeMans [GTLM] and GT Daytona [GTD] created for the new Tudor Racing Series. And the results satisfied their wishes although there were 11 full-course yellows and a red flag, removing at least five hours of actual racing time.

I've always enjoyed following the hi-tech cars through the years from the Porsche 917 up to the Audi dominance with their Prototype racers. But the last few years, starting in ALMS GT, a competitive group consisting of Porsches, Ferraris, Corvettes, BMWs and Aston Martins has provided the most excitement. Porsche's 911 RSR won the new GTLM Class at the Daytona 24 Hour this year and came home first again at Sebring.

Factory driver Joerg Bergmeister crossed the finish line in the No. 912 Porsche 911 RSR 5.296 seconds ahead of No. 93 SRT Motorsports Viper to remain undefeated in its debut factory season. Patrick Long and Michael Christensen co-drove with Bergmeister in the victory. In the final hour the SRT Viper GTS-R





held a two-second lead over Bergmeister and Oliver Gavin in the No. 4 Corvette Racing Corvette C7.R when Gavin suddenly spun with 55 minutes remaining. With a yellow flag seeming imminent, the No. 912 team did a final pit stop and driver change. The yellow flag flew shortly after and when pit stops were completed, Bergmeister found himself in the lead.

In the other non-prototype class, GT Daytona [GTD], the No. 44 Porsche 911 GT America of Magnus Racing won after barely beating a yellow flag that ultimately positioned him into the lead after pit stops. Third place went to the Seattle-The Heart of Racing No. 23 Porsche 911 GT America while the No. 22 WeatherTech Porsche 911 GT America finished fourth. Both cars were managed by Alex Job Racing [AJR]. Unfortunately, IMSA erroneously penalized the No. 22 car for contact it didn't make. The 80 second penalty cost first place for the AJR entry. Alex Job, team owner, and long time FL Citrus Region member, is celebrating 25 years at Sebring and a history of nine wins. AJR is one of the most successful teams in sports car racing with 70 wins (since 1995) including two Rolex 24 GT Class wins in 1999 and 2013. This record is supported by 48 pole positions and 106 podium finishes. The team has won five championships (GTC 2013, 2012, GT in 2004, 2003 and 2002) complimented by their two GT class wins at Le Mans. The team also boasts nine Sebring 12-hour wins. AJR has also supported many





The Road America racing circuit, located near Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin, was the scene for the Sports Car Club of America's National Runoffs. This years fall edition marked the 50th Anniversary of the celebration of sports cars and racing. With a record number of entrants from each of the nine regions, the first day, Monday, began at 8:00am with a daylong schedule of practice for each of the 31 classes. Qualifying heats were held over the next three days with the championship races starting Friday morning and lasting through Sunday.

Making the long trek from the Troysport facility in Orlando to Road America for his third National Runoff was Sid Collins competing with his 1960 356 Roadster in the F Production class. Performing pit crew duties were veteran SCCA and Porsche racer Curt Zitza and Troysport wrench Jonathon Ziegler, and as the events of the week unfolded they were kept very busy in the 'corner paddock'.

The first qualifying session for F Production started at 10:40am Tuesday morning and set the tone for the rest of the week ahead when the front passenger side wheel had an unexpected meeting with an unburied section of the curb going into the kink which shifted the Roadster to the middle of the track, the nose now aimed at the steel Armco. Steering corrections swung the rear of the Roadster in the opposite direction with the nose now aimed at the concrete wall along the

inside of the track. Another quick correction brought the Hoosier shod rear wheels onto the damp track side grass which resulted in a complete loss of grip and traction and sent the Roadster into two long 360's that she came out of facing in the correct direction with the engine running.

Once the Roadster was back at the 'paddock on the corner' the crew began the task of assessing any damages incurred and with daylight slipping away they set about removing, repairing and replacing any damaged part of the suspension. With the next qualifying session set for 2:10 Wednesday, available work time was short and fast paced.

The qualifying sessions for Wednesday and Thursday were hampered by rain and cold temperatures. The latter day's sessions were almost total washouts as rain and strong winds kept participation to a minimum. When not out on track and weather permitting the Troysport crew continued to work with the Roadster's suspension in anticipation of the championship races with the F/P class set for Saturday at 4:00 pm.

Saturday morning came rain free but the temperature started cold and only got colder even with the sun shining. The days festivities began with the singing of the National Anthem over the pa system while the three safety vehicles, with flags flying, toured the track on their inspection prior to the start of the days



racing. In the Troysport 'paddock on the corner' the morning was spent finalizing all of the myriad pre race preparations necessary for a championship final. The hours passed, slow at first but as race time approached the pace of time quickened and it was time to start the Roadster, get the 1610cc flat four warmed up to operating temperature and proceed to the grid. Then it happened ...wiz, bang, pop ...clutch pedal to the floor, no resistance equals broken cable which equals no clutch! The race? Over before it began. For many of us that would be true but, for a driver as skilled as Sid Collins, there were options. The first was obviously not to start but that didn't sit well. The second was to start the race run some laps then retire thereby changing the dns to a dnf. Not so good either. The third option was to race. Yeah, let's go and so Sid in the Roadster headed for the grid, in reverse gear, on the road that had been clogged all day with fans, cars and other odd assorted vehicles. Once to the grid, #60 was positioned lower than the original qualifying position but that was of little consequence and once they reached the track it was time to race.

With only a four speed gearbox in the Roadster, the entry from Orlando was already at a disadvantage on the long straights of the Road America circuit versus the five speed gearboxes of the Acura's and the Mazda's. This limitation was magnified by the fact that now the Roadster only had three forward gears available and fourth wasn't one of them.

At the drop of the green flag the thirty two competitors screamed along the front straight and past the start/finish line. For forty minutes they hammered down the straights; the 'Hurry Downs', the 'Kettle Downs', and the 'Road America Straight'. Braking and downshifting into the turns; the 'Moraine Sweep', the Carousel', 'Canada Corner' and the hard down hill lefty known only as 'Turn 8'.

Lap after lap Sid piloted the clutchless Porsche with a passion and a determination to cross the finish line at

race end. He lost ground on those long Road America straights, gained it back through the curves and corners. He drove his way past several of the other competitors on the track and picked up additional places as other cars succumbed to their own mechanical maladies. Then it was over, the checkered flag shown, the racers crossed the start/finish line. One more circuit of Road America for a cool down and for the Roadster a return to the 'paddock on the corner' where a small group of family and friends waited.

And in the end fifty years of advancing automotive technology was too much to overcome. But the winner is not always the first car to cross the finish line. There are many kinds of victories and many ways to claim victory. For the Roadster it was a victory to have qualified for and been invited to race. For Curt and Jonathon and the others of the support staff it was a victory to have the Roadster up and running for every practice and qualifying session. For Sid Collins the victory was running a good, clean, hard race and rolling the Roadster into the trailer undamaged at the end of a long week.

Porsche Press Release

The two most powerful and fastest mid-engine sports models from Porsche are ready and raring to go: with uprated engines and excellent PASM chassis the Boxster GTS and Cayman GTS set new benchmarks for sportiness in their segment. The independent front and a modified rear end, blackened bi-xenon headlights - with the Porsche Dynamic Light System (PDLS) as standard – and exterior lettering in silky black gloss are subtle yet unmistakable features of the new top models. The name says it all: at Porsche "GTS" stands for Gran Turismo Sport and has promised outstanding Porsche performance ever since the legendary 904 Carrera GTS dating back to 1963. With the new two-seaters Porsche is renewing its commitment to authentic sports cars for both the racetrack and everyday use.

The six-cylinder boxer engines fitted in the new top models are based on the 3.4-litre engines from the Boxster S and Cayman S respectively. Thanks to optimised fine tuning they now deliver an additional 15 hp. This means that the Boxster GTS now has an output of 330 hp, whilst the Cayman GTS delivers 340 hp. The torque has also increased by ten newton metres in each model. What's more, the Sport Chrono package is a standard feature in both mid-engine sports cars. This means that in conjunction with the optional Doppelkupplungsgetriebe (PDK) and the active Sport Plus button, the Boxster GTS sprints from 0-100 km/h

in 4.7 seconds, whilst the Cayman GTS is even a tenth of a second faster. Both vehicles therefore set new reference values.

The Boxster GTS and Cayman GTS combine top driving dynamics with the typical Porsche spread with undiminished ride comfort and exclusive features. For example, the combination of PASM and the Sport Chrono package as standard enables the driver to switch between progressive sportiness on the one hand and long-distance comfort on the other hand at the press of a button. The tyres measuring 235/35 at the front and 265/35 at the rear on 20-inch Carrera Swheels provide the perfect setup for both. Both two-seaters come with sports seats and leather interiors as standard. Like other GTS models from Porsche they are refined with Alcantara elements.

With the new models Porsche is now extending the GTS principle to the Boxster and Cayman. Like the Cayenne GTS and Panamera GTS, these are extremely sporty top models that stand for superior driving dynamics in their segment. The combination of letters originates from the 904 Carrera GTS, a race car dating back to 1963 that could also be registered for use on public roads. In the 1980s and 1990s the 924 GTS and 928 GTS cultivated this principle. It was reborn in 2007 in the form of the Cayenne GTS, and was subsequently also implemented in the 911 series and the Panamera.


