



Way back in March of this year, our Citrus Region had a road trip to the Salvador Dali Museum in St Petersburg. Originally, we ran this guided drive a couple of times when our region hosted the 2014 Escape for the Porsche Club of America. The event was received so well, we revived it to run for our own members.

In order to keep people occupied during the trek, a packet full of trivia was handed out. Covering the Mouse styled powerpole to the Dali Museum itself and everything in between, it provided a relief for the passengers, and hopefully the driver vicariously through them. The trip was long enough at only 65-70mph; we didn't want any of the cars drifting off the road due to boredom!

Using the same route from 2014, our convoy avoided downtown Tampa. Going south down I-75, we crossed the Skyway Bridge after a break at a rest stop. Arriving at the Museum, we were able to see some of the preparations that were taking place for the St Pete Grand Prix. Our little train of Porsches even attracted another Carrera from the Suncoast to park with us.

If you haven't visited the Dali Museum, you are missing a real sight. Salvador Dali is known as a

surrealist. And he most definitely is, but so much of his work is accessible. The amazing thing is Dali put so much detail into his work. At times he would use a single bristle for a single line. Yet some paintings are so large that unless you step back from it, you cannot see it because it is so layered. Being able to paint photo-realistic scenes and re-use imagery from one work to the next, Dali is easily one of the most influential artists of the twentieth century.

Our last stop of the day was a late lunch at the Hofbrauhaus just a couple of blocks away. This German restaurant is located at the former multilayered cafeteria of the St Pete Times. It is a huge opened-floored galley. There is bench seating everywhere, much like a true beir haus in Germany. A DJ, singing along to his music, was pumped throughout the building. He was difficult to miss as he had his own perch overlooking the floor with multi-colored lights playing off of him. The amount of food that was served was impressive, and these were lunch portions. For the amount that it cost, the portions were well worth it! This was how a Porsche trip should always end.

At 17, my daughter Sarah showed some interest in high performance driving. She had visited Roebling Road Raceway a couple years ago when I was attending my first driver education (DE). In casual discussions with Sarah we would consider the possibility of her participating in a high performance driving event when she turned 18. Well, this past year she turned 18 and two months after her birthday Sarah was registered for her first DE at Roebling.

Well, okay Dad, you eased her into trying an event and now she agrees to drive your Cayman S on the track. Now there's a dad's trust!

It was recommended by a number of fellow instructors that I should not be her instructor. After some thought, this recommendation made good sense - no doubt! So I reached out to Simon Youngman to be her DE instructor - good decision, a very good decision. Simon did a great job.

Saturday morning, event on, Sarah's first class over, time to get on the track, this is really happening! Then you hear over the track PA system, "green run group to the grid." There she goes;

Sarah puts her hair up, dons my first open-faced white helmet (not quite "styling" I was informed), adjusts sun glasses, takes keys and settles herself into the drivers seat. Simon gets in, "communicators" are adjusted, and they proceed to the grid. There she goes - following a group of high performance vehicles.

I fully trust the PCA driver education format and fully trust our instructors, but still, as a dad watching his young daughter go out on the track for the first time - well I had mixed emotions to say the least.

So I take my observation position at turn #5 and here comes #47. Silently giving the instruction, "Okay, set driving line up for turn-in, nice smooth track-out." Nicely done! That's my daughter driving #47!

Usually track sessions seem to fly by but, for some reason Sarah's seemed to last extra-long. I could see the smile on her face as the car came to a stop. "How was it, how do you feel, everything okay?" I had more inquiries, but Sarah gave me that daughter to dad look, "It was great, fantas-

tic," she replied. She removed her helmet and we proceeded directly to the Apex trailer for her own closed-faced black helmet. We were now set for the rest of the week-end.

As the week-end progressed Sarah's track driving improved as well as her pace. She would come in after a track session and tell me her speed down the straight; 105 to 110 to 115, and finally Sunday a 126. Sarah would also text her mom to inform her of the track speeds; no telling what Mom was thinking with these updates! Sarah also started to discuss certain turns at dinner Saturday night - imagine!

I was finally granted permission to go out with Sarah on Sunday afternoon and was truly impressed. She drove a good clean line and with pace.

I told a few people that I believed that my daughter was maybe a little better than I was at my first green run group DE. Sort of an interesting feeling to sit in the passenger seat with your 18-year- old daughter shooting down the straight at 120 plus - mercy!

It was a great week-end with my daughter. Sitting in our track chairs between track times sharing



a Gatorade and discussing proper line, braking, steering control and corners. It is a great feeling to share a passion. I thoroughly recommend you give it a try, but remember it's a two-way street.

The PCA has good reason to be proud of its high performance driver education program. Thank you Simon, and all the PCA instructors, you are a great group of individuals.

Sarah and I are looking forward to the Citrus February event. I will be her instructor and cannot wait. You never know one of these days Sarah and I may go mano-a- mano in a solo run group ... it's coming!

A couple of weeks after her DE she said, "DE helped me become a better everyday driver."



GIRUS A Quick History of Zonefest

This year's Zonefest is at Sebring, Memorial Day weekend (May 27-30). The following was taken from an article written by the late Mike Joffee, former Gold Coast Region Historian and Zonefest Chairman/Co-Chairman 25 times over.

1972-1973: Gold Coast Region (GCR) decided to put on a multi-region weekend. It was held in October at the Hilton Hotel in Port St. Lucie and was called The Florida Parade. Being a success, The Florida Parade was held again in October 1973 at the Colonnades Hotel in Palm Beach.

1974-1980: GCR changed the name to Sonnefest and due to the gas shortage, moved it to Sebring in order for it to be closer to the other regions. The date was changed to Memorial Day weekend. The hotel was Harder Hall. This event became very popular and successful.

1981-1990: After Harder Hall closed, Sonnefest was moved to the Holiday Inn in Lake Placid. In 1982 it was moved to the brand new Holiday Inn in Sebring. It remained there until 1990.

1991: Sonnefest was held at the Sheraton Hotel in Palm Beach.

1992-1994: Sonnefest was held at the Palm Beach Polo Club in Wellington.

1995: Sonnefest was held at the Marriott Hotel in West Palm Beach.

1996: Due to the lack of attendance for the prior

few years, Gold Coast Region joined forces with Suncoast Region which had also had attendance problems at their multiregion event. Sonnefest was moved to Inn on the Lakes in Sebring.

1997-1998: Joining together with the Suncoast Region proved to take care of the attendance problem, so both regions changed the name Sonnefest to Porschefest. The event was moved to the Holiday Inn in Sebring.

1999-2001: Porschefest was held at the Admiral Lehigh Resort in Lehigh Acres.

2002: Porschefest was put on primarily by the Suncoast Region and held at the Saddlebrook Resort as a "warm-up" for the National Porsche Parade to be held there in 2003.

So after a mediocre 2010 Zonefest, it was decided that individual regions would put it on each year. **2011:** Suncoast hosted Zonefest for their 50th anniversary

2012: Space Coast hosted Zonefest for their 40th anniversary

2013: Gold Coast hosted Zonefest for their 50th anniversary

2014: Citrus region hosted Zonefest for their 40th anniversary

2016: Gold Coast Region will host Zonefest in Sebring







Stuttgart. The fourth, redeveloped generation of the mid-engine sport coupé has a more striking, athletic and efficient appearance. Just a few weeks after the debut of the new 718 Boxster, the new 718 Cayman is extending the new model series. For the first time, the hard-top is priced below the roadster – in a similar way to the 911 models.

The same new four-cylinder flat engines with turbocharging as in the 718 Boxster are being deployed in the 718 Cayman. As a result, coupé and roadster have an identical engine output for the first time. The entry-level version starts with 300 hp from two litres of displacement. The S model delivers 350 hp with a displacement of 2.5 litres. This represents 25 hp more power compared to the predecessor models.

The 2.5-litre engine of the 718 Cayman S features a turbocharger with variable turbine geometry (VTG), a technology hitherto used exclusively in the 911 Turbo. In the 718 Cayman S, the VTG charger additionally has a wastegate for the first time. It delivers up to 420 Nm (an extra 50 Nm) to the crankshaft at engine speeds between 1,900 and 4,500 rpm. For the driver this means even better torque in all engine speed ranges.

In terms of their driving dynamics, the new 718 Cayman models follow in the tracks of the classic 718 cars. Thanks to their outstanding agility, the historic mid-

engine sports cars won numerous races in the 1950s and 1960s such as the Targa Florio and Le Mans. Lateral rigidity and wheel tracking have been improved in the completely retuned chassis of the 718 Cayman; springs and stabilisers have been designed to be firmer and the tuning of the shock absorbers has been revised. The steering, which has been configured to be ten per cent more direct, enhances agility and driving fun. The rear wheels, which are one-half of an inch wider, in combination with the redeveloped tyres result in an increased lateral force potential and hence in greater cornering stability.

Driving dynamics options such as the Sport Chrono Package and Porsche Torque Vectoring (PTV) allow the sporty character of the 718 Cayman to be further customised.
