It's been a hot summer in the Sunshine State, but the Florida Citrus Region stayed cool with a road trip to the Revs Institute for Automotive Research, home of the renowned Collier Collection. In late July, a colorful caravan of Porches (replete with happy drivers and riders) motored its way westward to enjoy the great Gulf Coast breezes, abundant eats and drinks, and fine fellowship offered in Sarasota, Punta Gorda, and Naples. The crown jewel of our three-day event was a guided tour of Revs Museum.

The Collier Collection is amazing! It's a "must see" for every car lover. Even if you're not an appreciator of automotive advancements, the sheer breadth and beauty of the 100-year history (1896 to 1995) on display will leave you turbo charged. Do early streetcars turn your tires? Or do racecars get you spun up? Either way, Revs has you covered, from A to V.

We're guessing, like us, you may be partial to Porsches. If that's the case, you'll be inspired by the 21 vehicles we perused, including the 356C, 550 Coupe, 550A Spyder, 718 RSK Spyder, 904 Carrera GTS (Red and Siliver), 906 Carrera 6, 908/3, 908 LH, 910/6, 911, 911R, 914/6 GT, 917K, 917 PA, Abarth Carrera GTL, Behra Formula II, Carrera GT Speedster, Elva, RS-60 Spyder, and RS-61L Spyder. My favorite is the red 904 Carrera GTS, but there's so much eye candy, I'll be signing up for a return trip to Revs. Hope to see you there!

I had the wonderful opportunity to visit the Porsche Museum in Stuttgart, Germany, this year. The Museum is a journey through the history of Porsche. A vision that becomes reality. It is one of the most spectacular car museums in the world with over 80 vehicles in a 5,600 square metre exhibition area. I took the train from Frankfurt with two changes and landed immediately across from the Porsche Museum which had its own train stop. It was a brilliant sunny day and the large legendary building looked immense right before me. Without even entering the building I was already overwhelmed with excitement.

In July 2004, the decision was reached to launch the most spectacular building project in the history of Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG. The Viennese architects office Delugan Meissl Associated Architects were chosen to design the museum. Actual construction began in October 2005. In December 2008, the Museum was handed over to Porsche exactly on time and was truly a spectacular building. Supported on just three V-shaped columns, the museum's dominant main structure seems to float above the ground like a monolith. This bold and dynamic architecture reflects the company's philosophy. The building visibly translates the dynamic nature of the Porsche brand into architecture. From every angle, the shapes of the monolith and base building look different thanks to their polygonal, avant garde forms and the variation in the structures and windows. But that's just the outside of the building...wait until you go inside!!!

As I approached the entrance, there were several Porsche models parked in the front entrance so you could walk around and ogle them. One in

particular I was excited about, was a 2016 yellow 911 Carrerra 4 GTS (my favorite color). Could this be the car I had reserved for my "Porsche Drive?" Just waiting there for me in the front of this magnificent museum? Well...yes...it was!



I had signed up for a Porsche Drive, not really knowing what I was getting myself into. Maybe a turn around a track with a professional where I would sit in the passenger seat? Or maybe I'd actually get to drive with a professional? What I got was the key handed over to me and a little GPS direction and "have fun and see you back in an hour?" What?! For real?!

So off I went into the German country side, zipping past farms and fields and quaint small villages, and then zooming at 190 km on the autobahn racing everything that wanted a go! It was the best hour in a 430 hp magnificent machine with racing bucket seats! A highlight of my museum tour which I hadn't even started yet.



When I returned with glowing confidence and grinning from ear to ear, I turned over the keys to my Porsche companions and entered the monolithic museum where I spent the next 5 hours walking around in amazement. I was particularly fascinated by the Porsche Milestones which goes back to 1875 – the birth year of Ferdinand Porsche. To this day, family history and vehicle history remain inextricably linked to Porsche. More than 80 vehicles and many small exhibits are on display at the Porsche Museum in a unique ambience. In addition to world-famous, iconic vehicles such as the 356, 550, 911, and 917, the exhibits include some of the outstanding technical achievements of Professor Ferdinand Porsche from the early 20th century. The main area of the exhibition represents Porsche's product and motorsport history in chronological order. Both areas are interlinked by the "Porsche Idea" section, which forms the backbone of the exhibition.



As a living automobile museum, the Porsche Museum presents numerous special exhibitions on specific topics or meaningful anniversaries. As a result, exhibits are changed on a regular basis. The new interactive Porsche Touchwall is at the end of the museum's tour. The 12 meter long installation covers nine decades of exciting automobile history on the basis of 3,000 pictures, drawings and technical data so I explore almost all Porsche street- and racecars. It was amazing!

I highly recommend a visit to the Porsche Museum on your next trip to Germany – as a Porsche fan, it is a memory I shall never forget!



Harry's Lap Timer

Instant Telemetry (after you sort out the details)

I bought my first Porsche in August 2015 and joined the PCA- Citrus Region that night. The next day I attended a lecture on High Performance Driver's Education and the upcoming event at Roebling Road in October. A few minutes into the presentation I knew that I wanted to do this, despite what might happen



to my new tires. I had not been on a track for 25 years.

The event was serendipitous...pure invigorating enjoyment. My instructor was great. The Cayman S was a dream to drive. What a wonderful piece of art and engineering. It will make anyone look like Senna (as long as you keep your helmet on).

On the second day, just before the last session, my paddock neighbor introduced me to Harry's Lap Timer. "It's an App that times you while you are on the track and gives you some other info also. You should make sure you put it somewhere that will keep it from moving around." \$19.99 later, I downloaded Harry's Lap Timer Petrolhead Edition and entered my name, car and track, fiddled with the "Prepare Race" tab until I got a Ready status, threw it in the glove compartment and set off to enjoy the car for one more session. I ignored the loud ticking sound and focused on my dual objective of enjoying my Porsche and bringing it home in one piece.

I did not realize the seed planted in the glove compartment and the monster germinating there would occupy a substantial part the next 2 months of my life. Things started slowly. I put together a video splicing GoPro on board footage with videos that my wife filmed from the paddock and timing tower. Nothing fancy. No telemetry. Just a pop up script indicating 135 mph max speed. No, I did not look down at the speedometer just before braking at the end of the straight. I got this info from an excel spreadsheet output from Harry's. I am not even sure that it was accurate since the iPhone anchoring was very iffy.

In time, I became more familiar with the Harry's Lap Timer App and its potential output. I learned that you could get great video with telemetry overlays. The videos can help you know what you are doing and assist in improving your performance. You can also show your friends what you did all weekend. The on-board video and telemetry overlay is very cool:

- Driver name, car, Track Name, date, time and lap number.
- Accelerometer display recording lateral, braking and acceleration g's.
- Lap time displayed.
- Speed digitally displayed.
- Track diagram with moving dot, showing your position of the track.
- Top Left Track location Name flashes onto screen
- Max straight speed flashes up after a straight.
- Cornering speed flashes up after a turn.
- Top right When you cross start/finish your lap time is displayed.
- Sector times displayed
- Bottom Right If you use an OBD II device it will further record and display:
- Throttle Application in %
- Rpm
- What gear you are in
- Horsepower

- Oil temperature
- Fuel Level

But... There always seems to be a catch. Getting to this level was a whole other story. The guality of the documentation for Harrys Lap Timer is inversely proportional to the great work that has gone in to the creation and development of the App. Information and directions are found in many places: in the App itself, on Harry's website, in PDF documents and in Harry's gps - laptimer forum. Invariably they are written in a language that I will loosely call German-English. Harry also has the practice of presenting a procedure for iOS and the same procedure with different twists for Androids simultaneously. He also enjoys a nice long paragraph rather than itemizing instructions. Even an accomplished geek will have to reread several times. A beginner geek will tend to get nauseated.

I will spare the reader the full details of my geek journey and summarize. During the last 2 months, I have:

• Upgraded my iPhone 5S (16 GB) to an iPhone 6S (128GB).

- Purchased three iPhone windshield mounts.
- Upgraded Harry's Lap Timer App from Petrolhead Edition (\$19.99) to Grand Prix Edition (\$27.99). Upgrade was \$9.99.
- Investigated competitive data overlay software.
- Learned how to create a "blue matte" and overlay data in my video editing software.
- Learned how to create picture in picture features in my videos.
- Learned the challenges of manually synchronizing video with other videos, sound and overlay information.
- Purchased two OBD II devices.
- Returned three items to Amazon (Thank God for my wife's Prime account).
- Downloaded and learned to use Harry's GPS Buddy App (free).
- Downloaded and learned to use Harry's Multi-Cam App (free).
- Completed approximately 50 laps on my private (neighborhood) race track testing the video and data collection set-ups. For those who may be concerned about hot rodding in the neighborhood, I recorded astonishing



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cornering speeds of 0 mph while waiting for oncoming traffic and max speeds of 46 mph on my main straightaway (17-92).

I strongly endorse Harry's LT to generate cool track video to share with your friends and to enhance your track learning experience. I would recommend:

- Purchase Harry's Lap Timer Grand Prix edition outright.
- Download Harry's GPS Buddy App (free).
- Download Harry's MultiCam App (free).
- Purchase a robust suction cup windshield mount
- RAM Mount Suction Cup plus Adapter for Cars (recommended on HLT site)
- Mount as vertically as possible
- Upgrade to a smart phone with plenty of memory
- The video quality of my iPhone 6s is very good. The video quality of my old iPhone 5s was poor. (I do not know if this was a defective phone or a significant improvement in video stabilization in the iPhone 6S.)
- If you plan to use HLT to operate your GoPro

you must reserve your iPhone Wi-Fi connection for this purpose

- Purchase a compatible OBD II device with Bluetooth connection.
- While HLT + Harry's MultiCam can provide picture in picture direct, I decided to do this myself in video editing software (Adobe Premiere Elements). Having Harry turn on the GoPro camera helps synchronize the videos.

Despite the challenging learning process, I enjoyed the experience. I recorded great footage at my last track event and will be using it again at Sebring in February.

In July, Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada is a cool (literally) and unusual Canadian Province to visit and even more unusual when done as a road and ferry boat trip from Orlando. Citrus Region Porsche Club members Jim and Jan Peters made that trip in their new Audi Q5 SUV because their Boxter was just too small for their photographic and hiking gear. The trip of over 6,000 miles included ferry boat rides from Portland, Maine to Yarmouth, Nova Scotia and also from North Sydney, Nova Scotia to/from Port Aux Basques and Argentia, Newfoundland. The ferry from Portland is a fast catamaran (The CAT) that travels at 35 knots.

Once in Newfoundland they made the long drive to the Viking landing site of L'Aux Meadows which is a World Heritage Site because the Vikings lived there 1,000 years ago. Because it was mid-Summer they were very fortunate to see three icebergs nearby. These originate in Greenland and follow ocean currents for months to the Newfoundland coast. The trip included a boat tour of a fjord and The Tablelands in Gros Morne National Park. The Tablelands (also a World Heritage Site) is one of the few places in the world where the mantle of the earth is visible and was created by tectonic plate shifts hundreds of millions of years ago.

Newfoundland is a favorite summer home to millions of migratory birds including Atlantic puffins, gannets and gulls. Jim and Jan photographed all of these at close range as they nested with their chicks on the rocky coastal cliffs at Elliston and St. Mary's Bay. Whales were seen breaching in the distance at many locations. The Provincial Capital and largest city is St. John's, a very old city, having been "discovered" by John Cabot in 1497. Overlooking the city is Signal Hill where the first transatlantic wireless message was received by Marconi in 1901. A winding road connects St. John's and Signal Hill. Nearby is Cape Spear the easternmost point of North America and thus the closest point to Europe.

Newfoundland is known for its friendly people and Jim and Jan found that to be very true. People came out of their homes and shops to visit with them. 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

German Excellence

After a great 2015 season, our Florida Citrus Region club racers hit the track again in February at Sebring International Raceway for the annual 48 hours of Sebring. A typical PCA Club Race weekend consists of two sprint races and an enduro, with the accompanying practice and qualifying sessions. Our club racers were there in force, posting well in various classes.

Tony Clinton and Ron Zitza paired up in the enduro to take third in GT5 and ninth overall in a 1971 914-6. The team of Eric Zitza and Florida Crown Region driver Graham Partain finished sixth in SP1. However, our SP2 944/924S drivers continue to dominate the class, taking first, second and fourth – congratulations to Nort Northam, Fred Beasley and Aaron Jones for a dominating finish.

The sprints were again dominated by our SP2 drivers, finishing first, second and third in both races. Fred Beasley, Nort Northam and Aaron Jones dominated the podium. Spec Boxster drivers Mike James and Mark Peebles competed, with Mike James finishing thirteenth in both races. Mark had a problem in the first sprint, registering a DNF (did not finish) and therefore was not able to start the second sprint.

The next race was in April at the Peachstate 225 at Road Atlanta. This hilly and challenging track also brought the Florida Citrus Region for intense competition. In the enduro, Mark Peebles and Dave Edwards teamed up in Mark's Spec Boxster to finish twelfth in class. Nort Northam took first in SP2, with Fred Beasley close behind in second. Aaron Jones did not finish the enduro.

The whole crew was out for the sprint races. In Spec Boxster, Mark scored a thirteenth and twelfth, while Mike James came in seventeenth and sixteenth behind Mark. Denny Hanson finished thirteenth and eleventh in SP3, while Gary Jensen corrected his DNF problem in Sprint 1 to finish fourth in GT13 GT3 Cup. Fred Beasley and Nort Northam finished one-two in both sprints, with Aaron Jones coming across the line sixth in the first race – and joined Beasley and Northam on the podium in Sprint Two with a third place finish.

Mike James and Nort Northam made the trip to Watkins Glen for the event on the first weekend of June. Unfortunately, the weekend was not the success that Florida Citrus Region had enjoyed so far this year. Nort finished seventh and nineteenth in the sprint races, and was a DNF for the enduro due in part to a problem with the clutch. Mike finished twenty-fifth and nineteenth in Spec Boxster, and did not compete in the enduro.

Virginia International Raceway is a great track with a great history, and our racers were there at the end of June. Gary Jensen won in FTC5 with a strong sixth place overall in the first sprint, repeating that finish in the second sprint. He also finished third in his class in the enduro with a strong eighth place overall. Congratulations, Gary! Dave Edwards took his 996 Cup car to fifth and fourth in the two sprints, then teamed up with Mark Peebles in his Spec Boxster for the enduro – and a third place finish. Mark managed sixth in both sprints.

Our SP2 racers had some problems, though. Fred Beasley took second in the first sprint race, but then was a DNF from the second sprint after a shunt with a Cayman. He did not make the enduro. Nort was sixth in the first sprint, but a transmission issue at the end of the first race put him out for the weekend.

So we are halfway through the season. Where do our racers stand in the championship hunt?

As you can imagine, the national SP2 standings are dominated by the Florida Citrus Region with Nort Northam in first with 85 points, Fred Beasley in second with 72 points and Aaron Jones in third with 54 points. The championship will undoubtedly come down to the last race of the season at Daytona International Speedway on the weekend of October 22nd and 23rd. Mark the date and be there for this epic showdown in Daytona for the National SP2 Championship!





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Ladies Day Tech Session

When my partner Mike Colon and I began our venture into becoming the latest offering for Porsche Service in Central Florida, we did so as a part of the local PCA community. And in doing so, our first priority with Driver's Choice Motors was to continue to build upon the relationships and trust we have gained within this brand we all love, while providing honest and professional/dealer level service to both our customers and friends alike.

With Mike's knowledge of all things Porsche from his years with Millenia Motors, and my time as a factory technician at Porsche of Orlando, we wanted to find a way to support our fellow PCA members in addition to the great Tech Sessions held in our area that introduce beginners to Driver's Education and the other technical aspects of our track focused world.

When my better half Rebecca mentioned the idea of holding a Ladies Day to support the growing number of women involved in our local region, it seemed like an obvious, if not brilliant choice. I hate it when she's right! After running the idea by some of our local "Porsche Gals" (always trouble, think Hells Angels but in Porsches) to see if this event was of any real interest to the very members we would be catering to, and with the blessing of our Florida Citrus Region's President Lisa Lewis, our Ladies Tech Session was born! As luck would have it, the annual Ladies Autocross was to be held on Sunday, May 15th, so the day before seemed like a perfect fit. With our Ladies Tech Session now set in place for May the 14th, our main goal was to provide a safe environment for even the simplest of questions to be asked without judgment, while catering to the individual and specific needs of those attending and their Porsches. It soon became apparent that we had plenty of gentlemen who also wanted to participate (free booze, food, and fine German automobiles might of had something to do with it) so our event was opened up to welcome all of those wishing to attend.

With the event approaching, and with a final list of attendees in hand, I set out to provide a Porsche Factory Maintenance Schedule specific to their vehicle, a colored copy of the instrument cluster warnings that may come up in the event of a system failure, and a list of detailed instructions for dealing with emergency situations, such as getting a flat tire or accessing the vehicle's battery if a jump start is required (electronic trunk releases don't work with low battery voltage). I also included the steps to access your Tire Pressure Monitoring System to set the correct/required pressures as the engineers intended, and the correct procedures for checking/topping off oil when needed. The big day had arrived, and with enough food, mimosas, and bloody mary's to support a small army, we opened our shop to our special guests. A special thanks to Rebecca and Mike's wife Linda for putting together an amazing spread, and of course lan Collins, our bartender with the mostest, for actually showing up in a tux as promised to serve drinks! After allowing for some time to enjoy the food and drinks, and enough time for me to seem smarter and better looking after a few, we got our "Ladies" Tech Session underway.

I am not one for public speaking, so the last thing I wanted to do was stand up there and preach about oil changes and muffler bearings, etc. For back up, I invited a former coworker and friend, Ivan Wysocki, from Porsche of Orlando to help field questions, add to what we were covering from a different perspective, and to help our guests overall while covering some of our hands on topics. We started with a general discussion covering the items below to list just a few:







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Importance of factory maintenance items that can be overlooked over time (body drains and brake fluid for example).

Basics of brake pad and rotor measurements and how the brake pad warning system operates Alignment specs and readings, and how they affect the car's handling and tire wear.

How to top off engine oil with new electronic "dipsticks" depending on the requirement/warning. Tire Pressure warnings and how to check if a warning is for just one tire (possible leak), or all tires low with gradual/normal air loss.

The floor was then opened up for any specific questions our guests may have had pertaining to what we covered or any other concerns for that matter. We closed out the morning with a hands on approach to the Emergency Procedures listed in the handout given to each guest using Mike's shop car as our guinea pig, while also pointing out the locations of system components, the Emergency Tire Repair kit, and how to use it. This was followed by doing the same with individual guests cars if they so chose.



We sincerely hope that everyone in attendance gained a new perspective on how their Porsches operate and feel more comfortable about dealing with any possible emergency situations that may arise. In the end it's all about enjoying these vehicles, and we feel that an informed customer is a happy customer! Thanks to all of those who attended and especially to those who helped make our first event a success, looking forward to the next one!
