I love a rally! Our first ever event with the Florida Citrus Region (FLC) was in 2013, benefitting the Russell Home for Atypical Children. Dave drove his 2011 911 GTS, a vaunted 997.2, and I navigated us to victory in the Novice division of Bill Davis' clueladen caravan. As newbies to FLC, we didn't know many people, but that soon changed. At lunch, we sat with Linda Cruz and Mike Colon, who was piloting a souped-up, yellow Cayman that caught my eye. Fast forward a few years, and now I have two Cayman S cars, a 2015 for daily driving and a 2009 for the track. Since we had such a great time at that first rally, we've participated in nearly every one since, which brings us to this year's event.

Hosted by Millenia Motors in Longwood, contestants gathered to commune with cars and coffee. There was a parade of Porsches to peruse (see the crowd favorite, Jim Peters' blood orange 1969 911 coupe) and a plethora for purchase. FLC also debuted swanky, new polo and t-shirts. They are fantastic! Get yours soon, and wear it proudly. A hearty thanks from all of us to Ernesto and Oliver for hosting a great gathering. Personal thanks to Millenia Motors from me for feeding Dave's Porsche addiction. We arrived at the rally in the black 997.2 and left the rally with an agate grey 2015 911 GTS (991) and a lighter wallet. Last, but not least, thanks to Lisa Lewis for coordinating this (and many other) stellar event.

The rally consisted of 50 twisted-thinking, Bill Davis clues – some old, some new – that wound 60+ Porsches and 125 people through at least three Central Florida counties. We were tested on geography, English, math, animal husbandry, horticulture, and pop culture, among other Jeopardy-like topics. Following a pit stop at the historic Umatilla Public Library, we drove for the finish line at bucolic Camp Boggy Creek (CBC).

Founded by Paul Newman and General H. Norman Schwartzkopf, Jr., CBC's mission is to foster a spirit of joy by creating a free, safe, and medically-sound camp environment (e.g., swimming, horse-back riding, and theater) that enriches the lives of children with serious illnesses and their families. All campers attend free of charge, and CBC exists solely on charitable contributions from donors like us. Our rally raised \$7500.00 for CBC. Thanks to everyone who gave of his or her time and resources!

After our group photo (it's about the cars), we met CBC staff and viewed a touching video about the life-changing, positive impact the camp has on children and their families. We left our cars in the field in favor of low-speed golf cart rides to the camp dining hall where we enjoyed barbeque and all the fixings. Bill Davis announced the rally winners: Karyn Rinaldi and Mellissa Hershberger (Novice) and Dave and Jen Cloutier (Veteran).



Of all of the events (e.g., Brumos, REVS Institute, Loaves & Fishes tours, autocross, drivers' education, and Car Control Clinic) we've attended in our short time as FLC members, the rally remains my favorite. As members of FLC and owners of several German automotive marvels, we know we're privileged. Roebling Road DE & Instructor School by Lyn Perez

One of the outstanding contributions that the Porsche Club of America makes to its brand owner's driving safety is its driver education program. Porsche owners are able to take part in driver education programs sponsored by local regions at almost every major race track in the US and Europe, learning how to drive and handle their sports cars in the manner in which they were designed and in a safe and responsible way.

And the corner stone of the Porsche Club of America Drivers education program is its instructor training program, which prepares experienced Porsche Club drivers with the training to assist new Porsche owners in the driver's education experience.

The Florida Citrus Porsche Club was an early adopter of sponsoring driver's education programs and also of providing instructor training. And to this day, every two years, Florida Citrus PCA organizes an instructor training program at Roebling Road Raceway, producing a whole new crop of instructors to support the national PCA driver's education programs throughout the Southeast.

On February 10, 2017 Florida Citrus held its most recent Instructor School, hosting 20 candidates for a full day of training. A unique aspect of the FLC instructor program is that the national PCA

instructor training curriculum has been incorporated into an online training course which all candidates are required to take before they are allowed to attend the one day, on track portion of the training. The online course, designed and implemented by Kevin Duffy, the FLC PCA Safety Chairman, (who is also an experienced online curriculum designer), has built into it, accountabilities and quizzes that require successful completion of the material by the candidates in order to pass and qualify for the on track portion of the training.

On February 10th, the on track school began with a drivers meeting to go over the days agenda followed by a two hour track

walk of Roebling Road Raceway, by Ron Zitza, the Florida Citrus Region Director of Instructor Training. This assured that all instructors understood the finer points of the track dynamics and could teach a consistent driving line to all students at that track in the future.

In addition to a series of classroom sessions during the day to complement the online PCA curriculum, the majority of the day was addressing the various ways students learn and holding facilitated simulations and role playing, which helped the instructor candidates prepare for real life situations that most often occur while instructing new drivers.

The final portion of the day's program was an actual on course driving assessment, where each candidate was evaluated on their own driving competency and accuracy in negotiating the Roebling Road Raceway. At the end of the day, we were pleased to graduate 19 of the 20 candidates as new PCA instructors. We anticipate that each one will have many years of success, teaching safe driving skills to a new generation of Porsche owners.

Roebling Road: Turn 5

This past week-end was the Citrus Region's PCA DE session at Roebling Road Racetrack in Georgia. This biannual event is filled to capacity with not only our own PCA group but draws members from other groups as well.

My first green session at RRR was years ago during our October DE session. My first drive around the track the instructor and I drove the PCA line. He said that turn 5 was treacherous and turn 9 could be deadly. "If you get wheels off on turn 9 do not attempt to correct to re-enter the track or you will hit the wall." Where I should have been concentrating on going through turn 9 correctly, my focus became turn 5. It was the most difficult turn to navigate with speed and I had found my challenge.

It did not help that spectators would line the fence of the infield to watch at turn 5 due to the 'entertainment value'. This 'entertainment' was found when the solo groups- white, red and black, would drive. These drivers and their talent pushed their cars with speed and braking, riding the line between drifting the turn and spinning out of the turn. No one was ever hurt while we watched. The crowd would initially gasp in concern and then when the driver was ok the laughter and applause would break out for the unlucky driver who would have to talk to the track official for going four wheels off track. I also doubt the driver was spared any sympathy at that evening's PCA social with their friends and fellow drivers. I never chose to look at turn 5 as a treacherous turn but instead as the turn that proved your driving ability under extreme conditions and truly showed how well these amazing cars could drive.

I have attended both fall and spring DE sessions at RRR since that first October session. I chose to get a different instructor with each DE event. Each instructor brought years of track time to instruction and each one taught me something different about this track.

The turning point in my learning was an instructor who had driven RRR in the same model and year carl was driving. He even showed me how to


adjust things on the car to better my driving experience on the track (information not found in any owner's manual). He told me he knew what the car could do and pushed me through turn 5 and all others to give me an amazing new perspective of my car. Previous instructors had taught me different methods to get through this difficult turn and when discussed with this instructor he would explain "that is the best way for a Miata to navigate turn 5", or "that line is best for a mid-engine car", etc. These valuable pieces of information totally hit home with me since it was obvious how differently the cars were in weight, horsepower and even AWD versus rear wheel drive. Each type of car had to have a different method to navigate the turn. I was more confident now with turn 5 and enjoyed it more, if that were even possible.

My last instructor for blue group I will call the Jedi Master of Turn 5. He helped many drivers with this turn using one simple tip. Of course you have to trust your car and 'know' you will cross the apex cone with your left front tire and track out to the rumble strips with your right front tire without ever changing your steering input. My last class in blue session we discussed turn 5. The instructor of the class asked how many had driven a good line through turn 5 in the previous session, and a few hands went up. He pointed at me and said how many times? And I said 'every time' which was met with scoffs from the class and coughs of "liar" under their breaths as well as laughter. However at my check-out ride for solo, it was noted how well I drove the line through turn 5 and how consistently I did that perfect line.

As a word of advice to new or present DE students- do NOT stay with the same instructor for every session. You may get along great with your instructor and not want to take a chance on another instructor but you will be missing out on years of experience and track time from these dedicated, selfless people who devote their time to our love of these cars. I have learned something about a turn or the line or even my car from every single instructor. My track map is covered with notes from these sessions with some turns

or lines renamed for the instructor. Turn 5 should be a challenge to everyone; it just lets you know in spectacular fashion to everyone watching when you have driven beyond the limits of your car and the line of turn 5. Everyone can learn turn 5 if you have a 'Jedi Master' for an instructor. Safe driving everyone!




