

THE PERFECT GERMAN DRIVE requires a lot of planning and a good amount of luck! I had a vision of what it might look like, and with the help from an avid planner, a couple of sponsors, and mother nature, the vision became reality.

I've been a Porsche fan as far back as I can remember, maybe since I was about seven years old. My dad was a huge lover of cars and did some racing as a younger man. He owned an auto repair garage and I have very specific memories of his green Porsche 928. My three uncles on my mother's side have also always been into cars. One of them used to race rally and now owns a car dealership; another is a driving instructor, and the last has car transport business. As a kid, I was surrounded by car people and dreamed of owning a 911 one day. Anytime I saw one on the road, it immediately got my attention.

In 1992, I bought my first Porsche, but being a broke 21 year-old, I certainly didn't have the money for a 911, so I bought an orange used 1971 914. I loved that car! It was so much fun to drive. However, it couldn't reliably get me to work and eventually I had to sell it and buy something more practical. 29 years later (with my wife's encouragement), I decided to treat myself for my 50th birthday and finally purchased the car I had been dreaming about since I was seven - a white 2020, 911 S (992). Is it silly to name your car?! The Porsche app almost insisted I do so. How could I resist? So, after some deliberation, I named her "Gretchen," a name of German origin, meaning "pearl." I have had the car for over a year and a half now, and I still love it every time I get into it. It was worth the wait!

Prior to purchasing my 911, I

did get the opportunity to have a few fun Porsche experiences. My wife is from Germany, and we visit her former home quite regularly. During one of those trips, I visited the Porsche Museum in Stuttgart and rented a 911 cabriolet for the day through Porsche Drive. While the exact roads are hand-picked by Porsche, you can choose the kinds of roads you are interested in driving. I chose a route that included a small portion of the Autobahn, but mainly consisted of country roads. I had a friend with me, and we had an incredible time. We stopped for coffee in a small village, then drove the route some more, and later had lunch in a small town before heading back to Stuttgart. The drive was spectacular; it was truly an "Experience!" that inspired me to want to do it with others, and so I had the idea of putting together a "work" trip with two

of my manufacturers and some customers for a similar escapade. The following year, 2019, I made it happen – my perfect German Drive experience!

In addition to some work meetings, the main purpose of the trip was to build stronger and more personal relationships with the each of the six customers invited, spending time doing something fun and unique that they may not otherwise do by themselves – like drive Porsches all day on some of the best roads in Germany! To make it work, six manufacturer hosts each paired up with a customer guest.

Prior to the trip, my wife Jennifer (who is also our Director of Marketing) did some heavy research on the roads of Germany. She loves to plan! I wanted to make sure we had a full day of driving with breaks about every two hours, so she scoured the Internet looking at motorbike and driving enthusiast forums to find the best roads to drive with great places to stop along the way.

Although I knew the cars would have navigation systems, I wanted to do the specific route Jen put together; plus, the car systems are notoriously difficult to program down to the turn, and I knew some drivers were more experienced and adventurous than others. To ensure no one would get lost, I purchased six portable Garman GPS units with international maps, took the route information Jen gave me, and used Garmin's Basecamp to map out every road, every turn, and every stop. Once the Basecamp file was created, I loaded it in.

WE LEFT THE STATES on a Wednesday evening and arrived in Frankfurt on Thursday morning. I arranged transportation to get everyone to our hotel in Heidelberg, a beautiful, picturesque town with a castle that overlooks the Neckar River. It's also home to a prestigious university, one of the oldest

in Europe. We hosted a welcome dinner that Thursday night on the river and walked across the old bridge into the historic part of Heidelberg for some light sightseeing. The following day, Friday, was the first of our roundtable meetings. After the business was done, we visited one of the oldest breweries in Germany and had some incredible traditional German food.

Saturday was the drive day! The weather was perfect, with a high of 82 degrees and barely a cloud in the sky. I had arranged for a representative from European Luxury Rentals to deliver the cars to the hotel, and meet me in the hotel lobby at 8:30 AM. There was some paperwork to complete and waivers for each of the drivers to sign. Then we walked down to the parking garage and there were a total of six black 2019 911's (991.2) lined up, four Black 911 4 GTS coupes, and two 911 GTS cabriolets. What amazing luck to have all GTS modes, current year, all the same color cars! After pairing up each customer guest with a host, I handed them a GPS and the keys to their Porsche and sent them on their way.

The itinerary began at our hotel in Heidelberg at 9:00 AM. We exited the town to the A5 Autobahn, heading north towards Frankfurt. We got about 40 minutes of Autobahn driving before exiting smaller roads, heading onto east into the Odenwald, a low mountain range with dense forests and hidden castles, making our way towards the town of Walldürn. I sat shotgun to my guest, CV. I learned very quickly that CV grew up in a racing family and did quite a bit of Indy car racing himself as a young man. He also owned a 911 or two in the past and was very familiar with the car and its limits. While it was obvious he was very experienced, it didn't make it any less nerve-racking... There were definitely a few times where I felt myself grabbing the doorhandle.

After two hours of driving, we met at our first waypoint, a coffee shop in the German town of Walldürn. There's a UNESCO site of Roman ruins there. The entire town is a living timeline of history. Built in 1448, Walldürn's City Hall is the oldest of its kind in all of Germany and there are remainders of the original fortification wall (mid-to-late 15th century).

Although some of the drivers were aggressive and fast and others were more conservative, we all arrived at the coffee shop within just a few minutes of each other. There was so much excitement in the conversation about the driving experience, the roads, and the views. People were already blown away. After coffee and conversation, it was time to hit the road again.

We headed south toward Burg Guttenberg on winding roads through picturesque landscapes and small medieval towns. We saw several motorbike groups along the way, who were enjoying the mountainous twists and turns as much as we were. I remember CV approaching a sharp turn - you know the kind, with the big white and red arrows - while we were heading downhill with a turn and embankment to the left, and a drop-off full of trees to our right. CV went in hot, knowing the brakes would get him to where he needed to be going into the turn. As we accelerated out of the turn, I could hear gravel flying off the wheels, hitting the trees, and ricocheting. I admit: expletives were said!

### DRIVING FOREST MOUNTAIN ROADS

for another hour and a half brought us to our next stop, Guttenberg Castle, built in approximately 1180, high above the Neckar River valley that's home to one of the few undamaged castle buildings from the Staufer period. Jennifer pre-arranged for the twelve





of us to have lunch in the Castle Tavern Restaurant, with a traditional German menu. The lunch conversation was entertaining and I listened to the different experiences each pair had. One of the pairs loved one of the hills so much, they turned back and drove it three times! We spoke of the mountain roads, the blind corners, and specific points that were exhilarating. We were all very careful of the speed limits when approaching towns, but a couple of the groups stated they didn't slow down quickly enough and saw the flash of a speed camera or two. Strangely enough, we never did get any speeding tickets. After our hearty lunch we walked the castle grounds and positioned the cars for a fun group photo. We took this opportunity for the hosts to pair up with different guest, so they would have the opportunity to connect with others on the drive. Then we hit the road again, heading northwest towards Dilsberg along the Neckar River, an unspoiled, winding river route with more castles and small towns along the way.

This time I sat shotgun to

Craig, a less experience driver. He had never driven a Porsche and had not done any performance driving in the past. We were first to leave the castle, but it was not long before each of the five other cars blew past us. I have to say it was nice for both of us to enjoy the view on the winding roads along the Neckar. We got to take it all in, windows down, sunroof open, pointing out the sites along the way. About an hour and a half later we arrived in Dilsberg, where Jennifer had picked out a café for us to visit. This cafe is known for their Eiskaffee, a not-too-sweet mixture of cold coffee, vanilla ice cream, and whipped cream - kind of like a sundae for adults!

While sitting and enjoying our coffees, a parade of people dressed in *Tracht* – men and boys in lederhosen and women and girls in dirndls – along with musicians playing accordions, tubas, and percussion, marched through the street, right past the café. Someone laughingly asked if Jennifer had arranged that too. Of course not, but it was a perfect stop, so we leisurely finished our

Eiskaffees while enjoying the celebration, and then it was time to hit the road once again!

**DILSBERG TO HEIDELBERG**, the final leg of the route, was only 45 minutes, and included driving along the Neckar and ending with a nice run on the Autobahn. The weather was perfect all day, but, just as we arrived in Heidelberg, the clouds closed in and a light shower began, cooling our hot tires! (Did Jennifer arrange for the exceptional weather too?) We made quite the entrance arriving at the hotel, squeezing six cars into the small city hotel driveway, sport exhausts bubbling, a car or two revving. The rental agent walked out, inspected each car and gave us a clean report! I was happy no Porsches (or people) were hurt during the making of this spectacular event!

Everyone on the trip thought the drive was truly amazing. We got to know each other quite well and had an incredible time. Experiences like this are always better with friends. Let my account inspire you to get out there and create your own perfect driving experience!







# The new 2023 911 Dakar

Porsche is celebrating a very special world premiere at the Los Angeles Auto Show - the new Porsche 911 Dakar, which feels equally at home on loose surfaces as it does on country roads, demonstrating that the concept of the 911 knows almost no boundaries. It harks back to the first overall Porsche victory at the 1984 Paris-Dakar Rally, which also represents the first use of the all-wheel drive system in a 911. To commemorate this achievement, the new Dakar will be offered with an optional Rallye Design Package inspired by the iconic winning car of 1984 (a two-tone White and Gentian Blue Metallic paint job with a red customizable start number).

The 3.0-liter twin-turbo Boxer engine makes 473 hp and 420 lb.-ft. of torque and delivers a commanding performance accompanied by the unmistakable Boxer engine sound. The new 911 Dakar accelerates from 0 to 60 mph in 3.2 seconds, and the top track speed is limited to 150 mph due to the cross section height of the tires for this model. The engine is paired with an eight-speed-PDK and Porsche Traction Management (PTM) all-wheel drive. Rear-axle steering, engine mounts adopted from the 911 GT3 and the body roll reducing Porsche Dynamic Chassis Control (PDCC) system are also standard equipment. The interplay of all these components enables the 911 Dakar to tackle sand and loose gravel especially well. Two new drive modes - Rallye Mode and Off-Road Mode offer excellent off-road performance.

The 911 Dakar features a fixed rear spoiler, a hood made of CFRP (taken from the 911 GT3, with large openings designed to extract air), and red front and rear tow hooks made of forged aluminum. The roof is equipped with a 12-volt-socket for the headlights of the optional roof basket that can hold up to 92 lbs. of equipment. A roof tent is available for the 911 Dakar as well. The interior of the 911 Dakar underscores the performance-oriented nature of the car with standard Full Bucket Seats and deleted rear seats.

The Porsche 911 Dakar is expected to begin arriving in U.S. dealers in Spring 2023, with a starting MSRP of \$222,000 excluding \$1,450 for delivery, processing and handling. The exclusive model is limited to 2,500 units globally.
