WHILE ENJOYING YOUR PORSCHE.

Do you often find yourself wanting to test your luck with our new "Super Speeder" Laws? Do you get excited if there are a few curves in the road? Or does terrorizing Autocross cones in a parking lot get you excited? Then why aren't you taking the plunge to actually test the limitations of both

yourself and your Porsche in a much safer environment? AKA a racetrack.

While you answer that question in your head, or even out loud, with all of the reasons that are personal to you, just realize that you are not special. I don't mean that as a negative, but simply that anyone and everyone who has ever found their way to truly enjoying what automotive engineers work so hard for has fought through the same hurdles. Whether it be a lack of even knowing where to start, the money involved, your Porsche being stock/a non-GT, or simply not wanting to damage your prized possession, there are many obstacles that can hold you back from taking the first steps towards enjoying this "hobby" we call HPDE. Even if you've never thought about the subject and think it's just not for you, this article is for both beginners and the slightly interested alike and will touch on these subjects while giving you insight into how and why you should take the plunge, even if just for a single weekend.

THE BASICS

So what is an "HPDE"? Well, simply put, it's a High Performance Driver's Education event. And no, we don't mean learning to parallel park with a helmet and race suit on (unless you pay extra). No, you will be learning to brake properly, correct steering inputs, and basically how to find your way around a racetrack at speed. The key word here is education, meaning the entire goal is to learn the capabilities of both yourself and your Porsche in a

safe and controlled environment. HPDEs are not racing events. I say this because there is often a fear of showing up in a stock street car to an event with nothing but racecars and professional drivers who will run you off of the track while you scream for mercy and question your life choices. This is not what you are signing up for. The entire point of these events, especially for beginners, is to both learn and have fun. It's that simple.

While there are many great organizations and entities running HPDEs and Track Days, for the sake of this *Spiel* article, we will be focusing specifically on our Florida Citrus Region's DE events that occur in February and October of each year at Roebling Road Raceway near Savannah, GA. Because if you're going to start somewhere, it might as well be with your local club, just as many of us have in the past at the very same events. In fact, after several decades of operation, many drivers still come back to our events almost as a homecoming for the social aspect and camaraderie just as much as the adrenaline on track. Like the fish that got away, there's nothing better than telling your friends and family about how fast you ALMOST went over cold beer or wine and pizza at the end of the day.

You may be asking "Why Roebling Road Raceway?" The simple answer is because this is where our founding members first set up the Florida Citrus DE program. Back then there were few options. And so, this tradition continues to this day. Also, RRR is a great racetrack for

beginners, especially while teaching patience and car balance. And while this close-to-70 year-old SCCA-owned track appears boring on paper, a two-mile long lap around its fast sweepers and nine turns is anything but, with very fast straightaway speeds and, more importantly, a decent amount of run-off space and a lack of walls in most areas, which allow for making mistakes while learning much more safely. Simply put, Roebling is a great first racetrack, and a great way to experience an amazing weekend on track as a beginner.

GETTING STARTED

So how do you get involved, what does it cost, and what do you need or not need to do? Let's get into it and cover all of the basics. First things first, you'll need to sign up for the event just as you would any of our Florida Citrus PCA social or driving events, on clubregistration.net. With an account on this portal, you can access, sign up for, and pay for any of our DE events. All of the pertinent information about the event itself, the location, and even the host hotel are listed, and if you have any other specific questions, the Event Registrar will be happy to assist you. As a beginner, you will sign up for the Beginner Student Group, or Green Group, which means you will only be on track at the same time with other beginners or those with minimal experience.

For the \$450 entry fee, you will also have a personal Instructor who is with you in the car for the entire weekend, so you are not being







thrown out on track to figure it all out alone. With this cost, you will also receive classroom sessions for your experience level, including covering the basics of being on track, safety procedures and even debriefs with the other drivers in your run group.

These typically cover who did what, saw what, and, more importantly, learned what. You're in it together, so egos and F1 Scouts should be left outside of the classroom.

GETTING YOUR PORSCHE READY FOR BATTLE

Now that you've signed up, congrats! That's one of the first hurdles to actually getting to the racetrack for the first time – committing to the date and paying your hard-earned money registering for an event.

First, you don't need a race car. You will learn how to be a much better driver using the Porsche you already own. This even goes for the SUVs and Panameras, which are more than up to the task. You are the weak link, and that we can fix! Porsche street cars are engineered and developed to perform with the power, balance, and brakes with which they are equipped. Most cars in the Beginner/Student Groups are completely stock, which is a perfect platform to learn what your Porsche is capable of while working on YOU first. Becoming a better driver and learning proper car control is the end goal.

Now this isn't to say you can just roll up without any





prior prep or a safety inspection. There are mandatory standards and safety measures that need to be addressed before you can safely use your Porsche on track. This is why there is a Pre-Tech Inspection. Porsche Club of America has a standard inspection form that must be filled out by an approved shop that you take with you to the track. Most Porsche service shops in our area perform these free of charge as a courtesy to club members who are attending our events. I'm obviously partial to Drivers Choice Motors, but there are several qualified shops on the approved list that can handle this inspection. It cannot just be done by your buddy or neighbor who owns a tool set and a flashlight, for obvious safety reasons.

In addition to this completed Tech Inspection, performed on a lift at an approved shop, there will be a last-minute final check at the track. The reason for these tech inspections are to check for overall vehicle health and condition and also, crucially, to check those items that typically wear over time and use (like tires, brakes, and suspension components).

Brake fluid condition and age are also of great importance, because with heavy use you can boil your brake fluid and that could ruin your weekend very quickly. The inspection is not just a way to just sell you unnecessary parts or labor, but the forces and wear on a car being used on the track is much higher than during your daily commute or rolling into Cars n' Coffee. Remember, safety is paramount, so you may need to spend some money to get your car prepared for your track experience.

Aside from preparing your vehicle, you personally need very little preparation to enjoy a weekend HPDE. You will need



comfortable, closed-toed shoes, comfortable clothing, and a helmet. If you can't source a helmet, no worries. Rental helmets are easily available from our support vendors. Don't go out and spend money on an expensive helmet. If you chose not to continue with events then you simply bought a very cool but expensive paper weight.

THE MAIN EVENT

Once you've registered and paid your registration fee and completed your Tech Inspection, it's time to have some fun on track! After a casual cruise up I-95 and rolling up to the gate at Roebling Road Raceway, you will sign some track paperwork and complete the final registration. At that time, you'll be given all the information you need for the weekend, including a wristband and sometimes some club swag. Your Porsche will then go through the final Tech Inspection to confirm that you're ready to go (loose items removed, car numbers and tow hook installed, etc.) and then it's onto our Friday night social for some food and drinks.

The next morning you'll have a driver's meeting with last minute instructions and you'll be paired with your Instructor who will guide you through the weekend and keep you safe on track as you learn. Your PCA Instructor will be in the car with you every session and they will have a helmet communicator for you to use so you can talk to each other clearly while on track. When you go out on track, you will only be on track with other drivers of similar experience, your "Run Group." Some drivers will be a little faster, some more nervous and hesitant, but everyone has to start somewhere. Be patient and courteous. It's not a competition. Everyone is out there to learn and grow as drivers and to have fun!

DAMAGING YOUR PRIZED POSSESSION

You may have a concern about damaging your baby. Granted, it is a racetrack and you've watched NASCAR races. But the honest

truth is that the Student Groups inherently have very few issues. Safety rules are strict. You will not have someone dive-bombing you into a corner or pushing you off-track. Can you pick up some rock chips? Sure. But no more than you would with driving through an I-4 construction site. If you have a real fear of something happening to your Porsche, then there are several track insurance providers who will happily insure your car for a single day, the entire weekend, or annually if you choose to make this a regular hobby.

RESTING MY CASE

In closing, my honorable Porsche owners and future track junkies, what have we learned? I hope I've adequately communicated that both you and your Porsche can get onto a racetrack, and have a safe and adrenaline-filled weekend, along with other FLC PCA club members, for very little cost, and you will live to tell your friends and family all about it. And you can do all of this while avoiding costly speeding tickets. Additionally, you will come out of the experience a much better driver.

I can personally say that for both myself and for many other drivers I know, that one key benefit of being out on a racetrack is that all other concerns in life disappear and your head space becomes purely focused on the fun happening on track. Nothing else. So come join us. What I'm offering you is Zen, only in a Porsche, which is basically like double Zen. I think. So will we see you at our next event? We hope so!



Tradition in motion: Porsche Heritage Experience in Iceland

A country born of fire that lives in the light of the midnight sun is a good place to talk about the future. And what it will bring. Iceland is more than a backdrop for the Porsche Heritage Experience. It is a landscape that embodies the mission of Porsche Heritage and Museum, to build bridges between the past, present and future.

A narrow tarmac track runs like a dash through purple lupins and rising thermal steam. A chronicle of time glides along it: six generations of the 911 Targa. Steel and aluminium bound as chapters, chrome as punctuation, tyres and glass as passages between Then and Now. Contact with the earth, openness to the sky, in between the track that continues to be written. If



as the epitome of freedom in its design. A signature that is updated over the generations.

Iceland, a geologically young and culturally ancient country, offers the right topography. Glacier and sea spray share the map; volcanic sand and lupins appear in the same view. In the morning, the air smells of warm earth, in the afternoon of sea salt, in the evening of rain. People have learnt to think with the weather. The roads align to the geology, not the other way around. So the cars from Zuffenhausen get exactly the space they need to show what they were built for: for technology becoming a culture when it comes from engineering and principles.

The conversation of generations

The Porsche Heritage Experience translates this idea into a curated expedition: six generations of 911 Targa cars drive for two days across south and west Iceland – from Skyrland to Fridheimar, and from the Commonwealth Farm, up to Pingvellir, where waterfalls, volcanoes and the black beaches of Vík await. Each destination was chosen because these are places where craft makes the value of heritage visible. The cars act as cultural ambassadors on wheels, while



enough to exist, open enough to accept the present.

Fridheimar is about an hour southeast of Reykjavík. Tomatoes grow between glass and steam in sub-polar light. Geothermal energy and gardening – two words that make themselves understood in one sentence. A small utopia under the domes; a family-run business that turns the resources of the village into a cycle. The clever connection is the trick here: technology that is not against nature, but comes from it. That's another aspect of working within a tradition: continuing the tried and tested using the knowledge and means of the modern age.

The next Heritage Experience stop takes us northeast into the Pjórsárdalur. There is where you find the Commonwealth Farm. Wooden tools, the smell of hay and iron, a look back full of respect. Here you can see how much pride lies in the craft. Here things are repaired rather than replaced and family stories are passed on. Anyone looking around will understand why Porsche Heritage and Museum views cars as cultural ambassadors: not because they shine, but because they create connections.

In the afternoon, the horizon expands in the Pingvellir National Park. Between the plates of the earth, Europe on this side, America the other, there stands a valley that practised politics early on: one of the oldest meeting places in the world. The landscape looks like a laid-back arrangement of principles. Separation can also be clarity, and distance an instrument of order that connects, rather than divides. Resistance arises where movement has structure. Heritage also works in this way: The line of the Targa

When the cars park next to each other for the night, the eye is drawn to a contour that has had a clear signature for more than six decades. The roll-over bar is a trademark, the glass rear section a contemporary window motif. The Targa is a



principle. Openness yes, but ordered. Freedom with responsibility. This attitude explains why further development looks familiar, from air-cooled classic to T-Hybrid, which sees electrification not as a break with the past, but as reinforcement. Innovation as a continuation by other means.

The morning after belongs to the water: Seljalandsfoss and Skógafoss. Behind the curtain of the first waterfall is a space where the water drips down; at the second you can feel the fine impact of the spray – like an elemental memory. Then on to Eyjafjallajökull, the white dome that has been deeply inscribed in the memory of Europe. Further south, in Vík, the beach lies out before you like a black chapter of velvety sand. Basalt columns rise as if architects had carved time into an organ made of stone. A good place to understand that culture always has a geology. Layer by layer, a slow development.

Heritage as a task

Porsche Heritage and Museum isn't in the business of nostalgia. It works on choice, and omission. What do we take with us? And why? What values have shaped the heart of the brand and how can it be carried into the future? The archive is a studio, the museum a workshop and driving itself a form of research. The cars are both evidence and a test: they show where we come from and check that we're going in the right direction. The aim is to keep the car moving, to bridge the gap between heritage and possibility, between lineage and new departures.

One sentence from the team stays in our ears: heritage is a promise to the future. Heritage is not a question of ownership; it is a question of behaviour. How do we talk about the past without romanticising it? How do we honour tradition without sticking it in a museum? And how do we remain open to what is yet to come? The answers can be found in the Porsche Heritage Experience by listening, sorting and specifying.






quiet reliability of an attitude on four wheels. The nineties are elegance and departure, the 996 shows off technology as a statement. And the current 911 Targa 4 GTS T-Hybrid is a sign of the times. It radiates a self-assured calm, supported by electrics, supported by mechanics, balanced between efficiency and expression. That is how this kind of modernity comes about; and it is not to be confused with mere novelty.

Learning <u>from the island</u>

What is left of Iceland when the Atlantic disappears in the rear-view mirror? The future is not the opposite of the past; it is its most precise reading. The country has learnt to live with extremes - wind, stone, fire, ice. This gave rise to methods, not myths. That is precisely the task of all heritage work: to put history into practise. It is not big words that count, but consistent action. Skyr as nutrition, geothermal energy as heating, the Targa principle as openness.

In the evening, when the sun does not want to set, the cars stand bumper to bumper: ancient light beside modern composure. The air smells of damp moss. The Atlantic crashes. The mechanical heat echoes it. First a crackle, then a very quiet humming. In moments like this, heritage can be heard: as a sequence of sound from near and far, as a rhythm of passing on. This makes it easy to understand what the team means by "building bridges": constant work between archive, road and future.





Rather than driving at track speed, the slower pace permitted a more focused analysis of the track line.

All in all, the camaraderie shared by these ladies is exceptional — each looking forward to the track days where they can continue to hone their skills, but more importantly share and mentor each other. Girl Power!


