TRACKSIDE ADVENTURES: ROEBLING TO THE GLEN

SIX TRACKS, COUNTLESS MEMORIES BY CATHY PEFFEN



A DAY AT THE TRACK (...OR MAYBE SIX?)

When my husband first started driving HPDEs back in 2012, I'll admit—I loved having the house to myself on weekends. But eventually curiosity won, and I tagged along. First Daytona (an easy day trip), then Sebring, and then Roebling Road when we became HPDE Registrars three years ago. Last summer I even braved Barber Motorsports Park in June—95 degrees and all. So what would 2025 bring? Turns out, a *lot* of track time, a whole crew of drivers, and plenty of friends, old and new.

ROEBLING ROAD - LADIES FIRST

We kicked off the year at Roebling, where the spotlight was on the ladies. No, I still don't drive during HPDEs—but I love watching people push their skills and chatting with friends in the paddock. Our drivers were front and center, and the atmosphere was a blend of competition and camaraderie. (If you missed it, you can read about the Ladies DEX in the Summer 2025 issue of the Spiel.)

BARBER MOTORSPORTS PARK - COOLER, CALMER, FASTER

March took us back to Barber, and thankfully, the weather was a far cry from last summer's swelter. The Alabama Region PCA hosted 26 different regions, and Citrus was well represented with 11 cars and 13 drivers: Mark Peffen (my husband), Lyn Perez, Mike Colon, Simon Youngman, Juan Fong, Andrea Jepson, Steve Campbell, Chris Campbell and his daughter Caiden, Kevin Sheehan, Bert DelVillano, and Randy and Carolyn Holihan.

With temps in the 70s, everyone—and every car—was happier. Several drivers even set personal records around Barber's 2.38-mile, 16-turn course with its rolling elevation changes. As for me, the track staff gave me insider tips on the best vantage points, so I trekked miles around the track spotting sculptures tucked into the landscaping. (The dangling lady and the ant attack are must-sees!) I even got to take photos from the starter's stand.

Since Parade was in Birmingham this year, we reconnected with Karyn Rinaldi and Ingrid Fong after they



did parade laps on the track. The whole weekend had the feel of a giant family reunion—with lap times.

NCM MOTORSPORTS PARK – FRIENDS, FAMILY, TOO MANY TURNS

The very next weekend, a smaller crew of Citrus drivers—Carolyn & Randy Holihan and Mark Peffen—headed to Bowling Green, KY. They spent time with family and friends in Nashville and Bowling Green during the week, and by Thursday, Mark Peebles had joined to round out the group.

NCM's 3.2-mile, 23-turn track is famously complex, sitting right across from the Corvette plant. Thanks to Kentucky Region PCA (special thanks to Perry & Denny Fortnoy), each of our drivers—who are instructors themselves—was paired with an instructor to sharpen their lines. Jaimie, Greg, Richard, and Kenny shared detailed coaching, which left my head spinning just listening. The drivers wisely concluded: "We'll sleep on it and be better tomorrow."

Off-track, the weekend was filled with friends and family. Mark's cousins came out Friday and Saturday, his

childhood friend drove up from Nashville, and one of Mark Peebles' longtime friends came down from Cincinnati. Saturday, the drivers finally felt in sync with the track, just as the weather began to turn. Sunday only allowed for one morning run, but lunch at the Corvette Museum was the perfect send-off.

We drove home just ahead of severe storms that caused flooding in Kentucky. Thankfully, our friends in Blue Grass PCA, including president Jaimie Diehl, were safe, though bourbon distilleries weren't so lucky.

VIRGINIA INTERNATIONAL RACEWAY (VIR) – HILLS FOR DAYS

After a short break, it was time for VIR in Danville, VA. Our "core four" (Mark, Randy & Carolyn Holihan, and Mark Peebles) were joined by five more Citrus drivers—Tom Taylor, Mike Hollosy, Chris Campbell, David Herzog, and David Young. Add in several friends we'd met at VIR before, and it was a full house.

VIR is a spectacular track for drivers and spectators alike: 3.27 miles, 11 turns, and elevation changes that had us flat-Florida folks panting as we walked or biked to vantage points. Turn 1 alone drops 35 feet! Luckily, a friend of Mark's who now works on staff at VIR gave me a personal tour, pointing out prime spots and insider details.

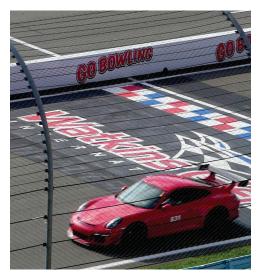
The Oak Tree turn is a favorite—though the original oak was lost to lightning, one of its acorns was planted, and now the "Son of Oak Tree" grows there. A mailbox nearby holds a visitor's journal where people from all over leave their thoughts, making it a living time capsule of track memories.

Outside the track, Milton proved charming with Aunt Millie's pizza and ice cream and Milton 66's bluegrass beer garden. Some stayed onsite in the track lodges, while others were in Danville, 20 miles away. Either way, the scenery of rolling hills was a treat.

CAROLINA MOTORSPORTS PARK - SHORT & TECHNICAL

In June, Carolyn & Randy Holihan, Mike Colon, and Chris









Campbell represented Citrus at CMP in South Carolina. Mark and I didn't make it, though I still insist a track with my initials deserves a visit! Carolyn reported back that the 2.27-mile, 14-turn layout was flat and technical—like a longer Roebling with extra challenges.

WATKINS GLEN - FAST CARS & FINGER LAKES

We wrapped the spring season with a bang at Watkins Glen in July. This time, Citrus brought a big crowd: returning drivers like Mark and Mike Colon were joined by the Holihans, Chris Campbell, Steve Campbell, Mike Hollosy, Juan & Ingrid Fong, Paul Lane, and Andrea Jepson. Some trailered cars themselves through the scenic hills of Virginia, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, and New York, while others flew in and had cars shipped ahead.

The Glen is legendary—3.4 miles, 11 turns, and seriously fast. Even seasoned instructors took coaches along for extra pointers. By the end of the weekend, Juan, Chris, and Mark had christened themselves *The Primaries* (yellow, red, and blue cars), a nickname that stuck.

For me, Watkins Glen was a spectator's dream. I

climbed high stands to see nearly the whole track, and Nancy and I discovered a pedestrian tunnel (more like a storm drain!) into the "boot." Off-track, we each found our adventures: I met my niece from Buffalo and visited wineries with Ingrid and Nicole Fong, Nancy had a family lunch at Belhurst Castle, and Chris & Nicole Fong hiked waterfalls before dragging Ingrid & Juan along for more exploring. Watkins Glen isn't just about racing—it's a whole Finger Lakes experience.

WRAPPING UP

Six tracks in one season: Roebling, Barber, NCM, VIR, CMP, and Watkins Glen. Each had its own flavor, from southern hospitality to bluegrass beer gardens to Finger Lakes wine. For the drivers, it was about shaving seconds; for me, it was about people, scenery, and unexpected adventures tucked around every turn.

As the team eyes bucket-list tracks for 2026, I'll be there too—sometimes trackside, sometimes off exploring—but always part of the adventure. Who knows where the next lap will take us?



YOU DREAMED ABOUT IT FOR YEARS. You've read the magazines, watched the videos and it's finally yours. Your perfect German sport car from the brilliant minds of Zuffenhausen. It doesn't matter if it's a Cayenne, Macan, Panamera, 718 or 911 it was built and designed with one thing in mind, to deliver maximum performance. Whatever segment you look at Porsche aims to be the performance leader. It's what we've known to come and expect as enthusiasts. But how many ever think about what it really takes to keep these perfect machines in top top shape? Luckily the same engineers that we love and trust also have figured out exactly what to do to keep it performing as it should for the long haul!

It should come as no surprise that a company like Porsche has thought long and hard on how to not only build the worlds best sports car but also how to keep them on the road! Over 70% of every Porsche ever made is still driving today! Porsche maintenance is quite simple when you follow factory procedures. To keep things simple I'll be talking about more modern cars. Namely anything water cooled when it comes to the 911 and almost everything else from 1996 to present. Service intervals are broken down into yearly services or every 10k miles whichever comes first. Oils, fluids and materials can break down even if the car is barely being used so it's always best to have the car serviced once a year regardless. Your first year or

10k miles whichever comes first is a basic oil change plus systems check and general overlook. The 2 year 20k repeats the same but adds brake fluid flush and cabin filter. The 3 year 30k another oil service(seeing a trend) plus spark plugs. Last but not least the 40k is your major consisting of oil, brake fluid and all filters. Exceptions to this repeating service cycle would be PDK or transmission services and belt services. Once again I've over simplified this to the most common models and there are unique needs to some specific Porsche vehicles. GT cars for instance have different needs

THE IMPORTANCE OF SERVICES are not only the service themselves but getting capable eyes on parts of your Porsche you can't see. You can't be sure if a line is starting to leak some sort of fluid. You can get ahead of before it becomes a costly fix! My best recommendation is to bring your Porsche to a shop or person that you can trust. Personally I've always brought mine to the folks that only worked on Porsche. That will assure you get a 10k miles whichever comes service and not just an oil change. Experience and passion matter. If you don't live and breath this brand I'll be looking for someone that does!

REMEMBERING FLORIDA CITRUS REGION CHARTER MEMBER DAVID ENGLISH

Florida Citrus Charter member David English of Sneads, Florida passed away at his home on August 18, 2025 surrounded by his family after a long struggle with cancer. David cherished his Porsches over the years, including a 914, a 1986 911 Carrera, and a beautiful black 1984 944.

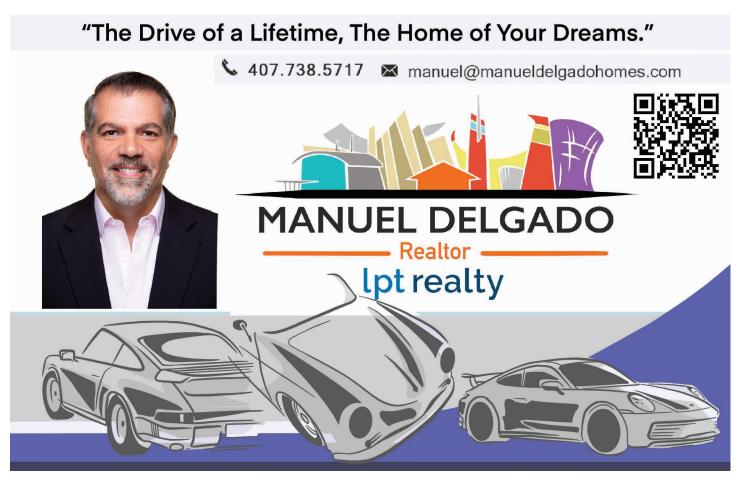
Shown at Porsche events, his 944 was like new, but had over 250,000 miles on it. He kept it and his 911 in stock, pristine condition while actually driving them regularly. He last showed his 944 in the Florida Citrus Region 50th Anniversary celebration this year, winning his class in the Concours. His 944 was purchased new at Contemporary Cars in 1983, ordered from the factory by our own Nort Northam. Nort and David traveled to Germany for the Treffin in 1983 to pick up the car. Porsche CEO Peter Shutz signed David's delivery paperwork!

David was born in Lansing Michigan on September 30, 1950. In early childhood he lived in many states as his father was in the U.S. Air Force. At the age of ten, the family settled into what would be his home for the remainder of his life – the State of Florida – residing first on McCoy AFB in Orlando. David attended Durrance Elementary School, Oak Ridge High, and the University of Florida in Gainesville, where he received a Bachelor of Arts in 1972 and a Master of Education in 1980. He had a long and fulfilling career in the field of mental health, beginning at the Orlando Sunland Center for people with disabilities, Sunland Center in Gainesville, Sunland Center in Marianna, and finally, the Florida State Hospital in Chattahoochee.

During these years he also owned and operated a very successful chestnut farm known as L&E Farms. David had many things in his life that he truly loved – he cherished his two daughters, Elizabeth and Jennifer, and his love for his Porsches could not be understated. Also not to be forgotten are his love of golf– playing courses all around the U.S. with his best buddies– as well as attending races in his Brumos Mobile, hanging with his race track camping crew Team Mimosa.

In lieu of flowers, donations may be made in his name to the Machen Florida Opportunity Scholarship, to help Florida high school students with their education at the University of Florida.

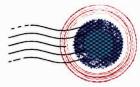


SAHLEN'S 6 HOURS OF THE GLEN JUNE 19-22

We arrived the day before the Sahlen's 6 Hours of the Glen, toured the Town of Watkins Glen, and

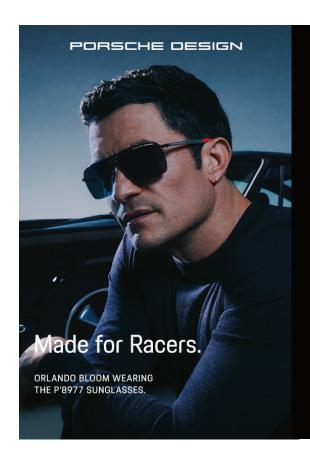


drove the 6.5-mile historic track that circles through town and snakes through the abutting countryside. Later that day, we embarked on a few wine tastings to finish off the day.

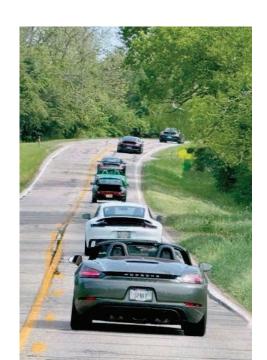
appreciated a bit of a break also, all nice and cozy in their rail cars.

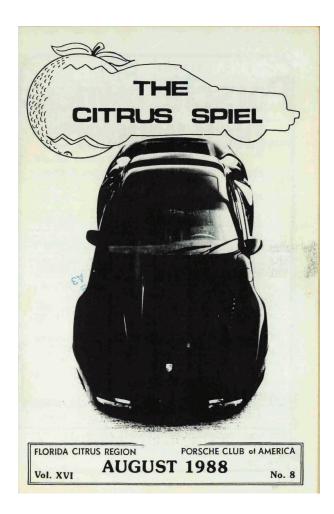

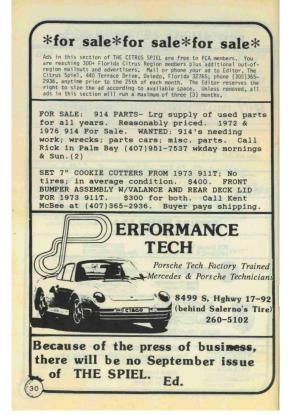

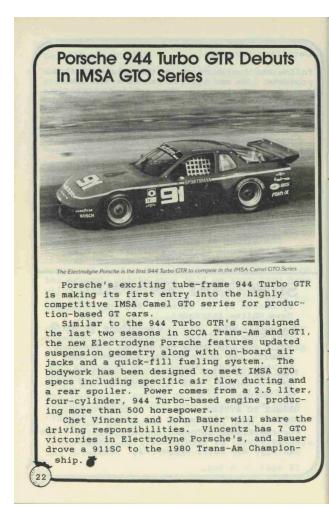

TECH TALK

THE WORKS AND WHY

An automobile that looks, feels and smells An automobile that looks, reels and smells like new is a pleasure to drive. It is no fun driving a car when your hands stick to the steering wheel. Nor is it fun going for a Sunday drive when you can't see out the windows, or when you have to leave them open to get a breath of fresh air. A complete detail will give your car the freshness it had when you first drove it off the lot.

will give your car the freshness it had when you first drove it off the lot.

With the skyrocketing prices of new cars, good used cars are maintaining high dollar values. There aren't many people around who can afford to trade in their used cars for new ones simply because they are tired of them.

Most of us sell our old cars because they don't run right or because they look bad. So, when the time comes to change cars, your detailed used car will bring more bargaining power. Whether you trade in your car to a dealership as a down payment on a new one, or you sell it outright to a private party, your clean and shiny car will bring top dollar. How can anyone quibble on price when the product looks brand new.

Along with the cost of new cars, auto painting costs have risen, too. A good auto detail can save money in the long run. Paint will last much longer. A well-done wax job prolongs the life of the paint and sharpens the appearance of the vehicle.

Preventive maintenance is less work on a detailed car. When an oil leak is detected, it is easy to repair. Once the car is buffed.

and occasional coat of wax will continue to protect the paint. The interior will need some attention, however, as time goes by. Its condition depends on you and your passengers; the more children you have, the more often Its you'll need to clean the interior.

Once a vehicle has been completely detailed, upkeep is much easier because the basics are done. A simple vacuuming normally keeps the carpets clean. Buffing the paint

should be done only to remove oxidation or blemishes (the process actually removes a layer of paint). Simple waxing will protect the paint.

believe a complete exterior detail might just help to increase fuel economy. An oxidized paint job feels rough to the touch, whereas a clean, waxed surface is smooth and slippery. A smoother surface should glide through the air easier. Although airplanes move much faster than the legal speed limit on the ground, pilots have told me that they have gained as much as twenty knots after a buff and wax. The same theory should hold true for automobiles.

A clean engine should also run cooler. Without a coat of grease and dirt acting as a blanket, the powerplant should be more reactive to the cooling action of the air blowing by it. Moving engine parts on the outside, such as cables and linkages, should operate easier. This includes the choke mechanism, which may be prevented from opening all the way because of grease build-up, causing the engine to burn richer than intended, a waste of fuel.

During the course of an auto detail, you will be using products and chemicals which could be potentially harmful to the automobile and detailer. It is imperative you read and

follow the instructions on the labels of those products. No one but you can be responsible for the product usage; when applied correctly, the various cleaning, dressing, and polishing agents will do an excellent job of helping your car look its best.
